Experts will explain about the challenges in developing products using new materials and creating environmentally friendly ceramics by combining the traditional techniques of kyo yaki and kiyomizu yaki with modern chemistry.

An expert will explain how to fuse the traditional techniques of Kyoyaki and Kiyomizuyaki with modern chemistry, develop products using new materials, and take on the challenge of making pottery that is friendly to the global environment.

After the program, you are free to enjoy the crafts on display.
